INSTITUTO CULTURAL CABAÑAS

It's the Biggest Colonial Building in the Continent, declared by UNESCO "**Heritage of Humanity**", It's proud to keep the masterpiece of Jalisco's artist José Clemente Orozco, inside in the inner walls and the cupola of the Chapel, you will see the "Hombre de Fuego". The building's architecture is beautiful and grandiose, with 24 beautiful colonial patios. Place for events, expos and art.

TEQUILA

In 2006, the "**Agave Landscape and Ancient Industrial Facilities of Tequila**"

were included by UNESCO in its list of World Heritage Sites. This distinction recognizes the culture that for centuries has been shaped around the agave plant and the production of tequila. The town of Tequila has also been named one of the "Pueblos Mágicos" or "Magical Towns" of Mexico.

TLAQUEPAQUE

Has become the most important center for arts and crafts in Mexico. Dozens of shops and elegant stores come together around a central pavilion, where one can select from thousands of finely crafted products. Much of the area's pottery (both conventional and stoneware) can be found here.
